Need some extra credit? Watch one of the movies below, write up a summary (1-page double spaced minimum or 2 pages handwritten) on the history you saw in the movie and attach your ticket and you could get 20 points extra credit for each (limit of 2). I know it is not the end of the quarter, but plan ahead! A little extra credit never hurt anyone.

"The Road to El Dorado" (2000) rated G:

The story is about two swindlers who get their hands on a map to the fabled city of gold, El Dorado while pulling off some sort of scam. Their plan goes bad and the rogues end up lost at sea after a number of misfortunes.

"The Emperor's New Groove" (2000) rated G:

Emperor Kuzco is turned into a llama by his ex-administrator Yzma, and must now regain his throne with the help of Pacha, the gentle llama herder.

<u>"Elizabeth" (1998) rated R:</u>

This is about the early years of the reign of Elizabeth I of England and her difficult task of learning what is necessary to be a monarch.

"Aladdin" (1992) rated G:

Aladdin, a street urchin, accidentally meets Princess Jasmine, who is in the city undercover. They love each other, but she can only marry a prince.

"Apocalypto" (2006) rated R:

*warning: very violent & graphic, in subtitles

As the Mayan kingdom faces its decline, the rulers insist the key to prosperity is to build more temples and offer human sacrifices. Jaguar Paw, a young man captured for sacrifice, flees to avoid his fate.
